

This is a conversation between Beverly and Rick Lambert and Juanita Broadrick at her home in Van Buren on 11-13 -97.

BL: Are you Juanita Broadrick

JB: Uh uh.

BL: Ms. Broadrick my name is Beverly Lambert, I'm a private investigator. This is Rick. Could we talk to you for a few moments?

JB: No, no you can't, what's this about?

BL: Were doing an investigation, working for the attorneys who are representing Paula Jones.

JB: That's what I thought. No I don't want to talk to you.

BL: Is there any reason?

JB: Yeah, its just that was a long time ago and I don't want to relive it.

BL: Do you realize that the attorneys are probably going to subpoena you if we can't talk to you? Is that okay?

JB: No, I do not want to be subpoenaed, if they do that then they will but they wont get anything out of me. I'm sorry.

BL: Well as you can see we have a horrible job, we've had to interview about 75 people and it's been tough.

JB: Where ya'll from.

RL: We are from Dallas.

JB: It's a horrible (word stressed) situation, It's something that I, I mean I've been a business woman here for years and this is my home you know, and when all of this came up before, and I had Washington, The Spectator parked down here.

I tried to go to San Francisco and they followed me out there and a guy trying to write a book

BL: So this is not new?

JB: No, so I just had to try and evade all of this.

BL: We didn't know that, we didn't know anyone else had been out here, we are just following lead sheets.

RL: We have talked to so many people that no one has talked to, and we had your name and drove all the way from Little Rock to talk to you. And

BL: Yeah. It's not pleasant and I won't even go into it.

RL: What you're telling us is that it happened though?

JB: No, I'm not telling you anything. I'm telling you that I've been harassed by a lot of media.

RL: Yes ma'am.

BL: Well we understand. We would love to talk to you. I'm going to say though they are probably going to subpoena you.

JB: It's very private, We're talking about something 20 years ago.

RL: Do you feel in your mind that Paula Jones....

JB: Oh, she's telling the truth

RL: She's telling the truth?

JB: Yeah, she's telling the truth. Anything she would say bad about him, she's telling the truth.

BL: We feel like we are doing the right thing, we are doing a difficult job but we feel that we're doing it for a very good purpose.

JB: Yeah.

RL: All of the attorneys we are working for are good strong Christian men and they are taking it with the risk of knowing what could happen, and we are too. We've already been warned about the dangers and what could happen.

BL: We really have a lot of women we are talking to. We aren't just picking on you or anyone else. We are following up leads.

RL: We have a gag order, and we can't share the information we get with anyone but the attorneys.

JB: Yeah, But I would never go into it with anyone else, never, sure wouldn't.

I thought maybe yall had gotten the recording and that's the reason you came.

BL: No,...

JB: Yeah there were some people that came into my office and recorded our conversation and I had no idea that they did.

BL: Recently?

JB: This is just before he was first elected.

BL: Oh

JB: That's when they followed me out to San Francisco. It was really bad.

RL: Who did that, the American Spectator?

JB: No that was who we thought was a friend that knew about the..... years ago.

BL: That's probably where our attorneys got the lead.

JB: Probably so, even at the time that it happened, they even called my son, who is an attorney. They called him out of law class to ask him if it was true.

RL: Goodnight!

JB: So whether anything is said, I'll deny anything.

BL: Well, they did tell us that you may be hostile, that's why I brought my husband and partner with me. But you're not hostile, you're just hurting and not wanting to drag up the past and I can't blame you at all.

JB: Oh, bad things, I can't even begin to tell you.

BL: I'm sorry...

JB: In fact the person who was in my office and did the taping said that his wife's good friend was raped by Bill Clinton but she was drunk at the time and that's why nothing could happen.

RL: Well, that's no excuse for me, I'm an old homicide detective from Dallas and that's not enough excuse.

JB: Yeah and that's Sheffield Nelson who ran for governor.

RL: His wife was raped?

JB: No his good friend was. So go hunt him up. (laughs)

RL: Well we have a call in to him, we actually do. We're talking to everyone.

BL: Well most of these people are recent people, I'll tell you he hasn't stopped his behavior since 20 years ago.

JB: Yeah

BL: Well we surely don't want to be intrusive. We don't want to leave here and you say these people were so rude...

JB: No, no, yall are fine.

RL: We just feel like here's a man in high places that is bullet proof, everything he's done from Whitewater on...

JB: But you can't get to him, and I'm not going to ruin my good name to do it

BL: Well, there's a lot of women. There are others.

RL: I don't want to agree with you because I don't want to think that's true.

JB: Well, there's just absolutely no way that anyone can get to him, he's just too vicious.

RL: Well, I feel like if anyone can bring him down, the Lord can.

JB: Well, I hope so, that's what I've been praying for the last 6 years.

BL: We're Christians.

RL: You a Christian?

JB: Yeah.

BL: Well we are praying that God is going to send us to the right people.

RL: The reason we took the case, the reason those attorneys took the case, this is a law firm that is all Christians.

JB: There's just no way I can get on the witness stand and tell that.

BL: What would you do if they subpoena you.

JB: I'll just have to consult with my attorney. I have an attorney that's always usually handled this. If yall got to me he'd be calling you instead of me.

BL: Would you be willing to give us his name?

JB: Yes, Bill Walters, in Greenwood, Senator Bill Walters.

BL: Alot of people we've talked to or attempted to talk to, we go up and they say "here's my attorneys name."

RL: Is he a democrat or a republican senator?

JB: He's a republican.

RL: Good.

JB: But I won't be cooperative.

BL: Even if your attorney would. I mean like would you fill out an affidavit to your attorney that could be passed on.

JB: I don't know.

RL: Well, pray about it. I think Paula Jones is a great American for what she's doing, I think all these guys who are taking the risk with their careers, including us, I mean it's a chance, but I, for one, and I know alot of people are tired of corruption in high places...

JB: Well I've been through this same talk before.

BL: They didn't tell us that. This is a sensitive subject...

JB: I just don't want to re-live that. You know, it was just a horrible horrible thing for me and I wouldn't relive it for anything.

BL: I'm going to contact the attorneys and tell them about what we've talked about today. And if there is any way for you to do a written affidavit instead of face to face I'll see if that would be possible.

JB: Well just tell them to talk to my attorney, okay?

BL: We will.

JB: Okay.
